INTRODUCTION

The IQAC of St John's College has been constantly monitoring the feedback of stakeholders in the institution to help in analysing where it stands as far as the curriculum framework is concerned. Feedback was collected from students, alumni, faculty and employers in the online mode in the academic year 2023-24.

ANALYSIS

For collecting the feedback, google forms were created and circulated among the stakeholders. Statistical tools and graphical representations are used to arrive at comprehensive results and effective presentation of the data.

STUDENTS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS


The feedback form was circulated among the PG and UG students for the academic year 2023-24. From 90% of the total strength of students, 50% of responses have been received. The majority of responses were from the students of the academic year 2023-24.

The feedback analysis form consists of 10 questions on which students reply each question as agree, strongly agree, not sure, disagree or strongly disagree.

73% of students agree (58% agree and 15% strongly agree) that the curriculum is designed to enhance employability. The inclusion of various skill development certificate courses helps the students to learn new skills in the area of their interest and provides them with other course certificates along with their degree certificates. Only less than 2% are totally unsatisfied with the accountability of the curriculum towards employability.



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Around 25% of respondents strongly agree that the courses offered are relevant and the contents are revised at reasonable intervals. 66.8% agree and 23.7% strongly agree that the courses offered not only enhance their knowledge but also to realize and improve their skills and compatibility.

Around 55% agree and 20% strongly agree that the teachers keep them updated and encourage them to keep updated about the latest developments in areas of their interest. Students are also urged by the teachers to search and know about updates and current affairs in their subjects through assignments and other class activities.

Remarks

- The campus environment is conducive for learning.
- All faculty members are supportive.

Suggestions

- More campus placement drives are to be conducted.
- Need skill development and more courses to prepare students for the challenges of the job market.

ALUMNI FEEDBACK ANALYSIS

Alumni-based evaluations are crucial for evaluating academic programmes and student services. A total of 28 responses from the alumni of various departments were received during 2023-24.





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
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


A total of 133 parents responded to the feedback survey on the curriculum.
